Conversion Rule is Sub + propose/suggest + to + object + that + Sub + should + V_1 (1st from) +

Hence options 'D' fits in the context.

Correct answer.(a) This is the case of Negative command of Imperative sentence. Conversion rule: Sub + asked/told + object + not + to + V_1 (1st form). Hence option A fits in the context.

Correct answer.(a). When 'Let' is used to allow in Reported Speech of Direct Narration. Then Conversion Rule is: Sub + requested/ordered + object + to allow + Sub + to + V_1 + object + ...
